70:00	ENG qualify for the World Cup in Germany with a 1-0 win over BEL. Their defense held firm over the last 20 minutes to deny BEL any goal scoring chances. The BEL's will now be hoping Ireland can upset Pakistan for them to gain direct qualification
67:44	ENG ball at the back
67:23	Martin JONES shoots a reverse stick shot across the face, although he probably should have shot on his fore stick as he had time
66:31	ENG break
65:32	BEL waste possession up front. ENG ball
64:04	With time running out the match still hangs in the balance with BEL only needing one goal to qualify
61:19	Maxime LUYCX gets a quick shot in but FAIR is up to the challenge and saves
60:24	Jon BLEBY makes a good flat tackle on top of the circle to deny John-John DOHMEN from having a shot for BEL
58:49	Both teams are running through substitutions as they seek a decisive break
54:57	BEL break down their right
52:06	HAWES comes back on for ENG
50:00	BRULE's flick is touched over by ENG's postman Glenn KIRKHAM
49:17	Charles VANDEWEGHE earns BEL a PC. ENG aren't happy with the decision
48:02	Incident ENG's Richard ALEXANDER is lucky to be shown a green card by TEN CATE. His crude tackle easily could have seen him receive a yellow
45:10	MANTELL's flick is saved by Cedric DE GREVE with the high follow up slapped wide
44:18	ENG PC. On their first PC they didn't give MANTELL a flick, surely they will this time
41:41	ENG long corner on the left
40:38	FAIR kicks it clear
40:22	BEL have a free hit on their left in attack

39:04	MANTELL makes a great long pass to his brother, Simon, unfortunately for ENG Simon can't make the trap on the right wing
36:30	ENG throw the ball around throughout their team as they are controlling possession well
35:01	ENG were out and in position early as they are raring to go for the second half. For BEL they need to look for goals as the second half begins in Changzhou
35:00	ENG have slightly had the better of an even first half in which they have a 1-0 lead to show for it. BEL was playing better towards the end of the half and started to create a few chances. As it stands ENG will qualify. An interesting 35 minutes ahead after the break
34:43	The variation goes wide
34:22	BEL PC from outside the circle, after ENG were ruled to have deliberately fallen and kicked the ball
33:27	Fabrice BOUREAD`HUI has a reverse stick stab at a bouncing cross. FAIR is quick to save the shot for ENG
31:02	BEL have a chance but ENG's GK, James FAIR, is off his line quickly to clear the danger
29:54	Loic VANDEWEGHE fires a quick shot wide
28:00	ENG long corner
27:22	Matt DALY and Brett GARRARD come back onto the field for ENG
24:01	Ben HAWES` shot is saved after ENG worked a good variation which found him open on the left
22:53	ENG PC after BEL lift the ball in the circle. MANTELL comes up from the back
22:08	Scott CORDON is playing well at left half for ENG. He has made a lot of tackles so far
20:19	ENG hold the ball at the back
17:49	BEL attacking down the left
15:52	Incident Umpire Rob TEN CATE calls over BEL's Amaury DE COCK and green cards him for a tackle and push from behind
14:28	ENG with the ball in good field position
12:52	MANTELL's slap pass goes straight over the back line
12:24	ENG free hit on the top of their circle
11:32	BRULE makes a good reverse stick tackle at the back
09:57	ENG are controlling most of the possession
06:41	Jean-Philippe BRULE makes a magnificent pass from full back to the right wing, but no one can get a touch on the next pass into the circle
03:54	Goal ENG goal. Well that will go a long way towards settling ENG's nerves. Barry MIDDLETON made a run through the middle then off loaded to Matt DALY on

	the left, who hammered a shot into the side netting from a 45 degree angle. 1-0 ENG
03:33	Both sides seem a little nervous as there have been a few stray passes
01:45	BEL with the first chance as Maxime LUYCX flicks across the face of goal
00:01	Belgium (BEL) and England (ENG) start today's action, with a place at the 2006 BDO World Cup in Germany to play for. A draw would see both team's qualify if Pakistan lose to Ireland in today's second match, which is unlikely. Otherwise ENG have to win, while BEL a draw or better will seem them progress. ENG will be hoping Richard MANTELL's form continues on PC's, while BEL, who have only conceded four goals in four games, will look to their strong defense to hold again as the match gets underway
